GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

Equestrian, Beef Cattle & Sheep Entries close on 5 February 2022. Entries will open 1 January 2023.

Entries will only be accepted with proof of payment.

All entry forms must be accompanied by the correct entry fees, otherwise they will not be accepted. We have introduced PoliPay and direct banking-we will not be accepting entries without immediate payment or proof of payment. Please contact the secretary if you require assistance. IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE AN EMAIL IMMEDIATELY AFTERWARDS PLEASE CONTACT THE SECRETARY TO ENSURE YOUR PAYMENT AND ENTRIES HAVE GONE THROUGH.

All entry forms must include the Rider's Full Name and the Horse/Pony they will be riding, this includes online entries. ANY incomplete forms will not be confirmed. Any spelling or errors in your name will be printed in the catalogue, please double check your entries (including capitals on names etc)

Late Entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Secretary and must be paid immediately with a \$15 late penalty fee.

All competitors and accompanying persons will need tickets for entry on to the ground – these tickets are in the form of your confirmation email which must be printed off and brought on the day.

Further tickets can be purchased for \$6 each before 1 February 2023.

OR admission for non-members to the Show Grounds is Adults \$10, children under 16 years of age free.

Grazing is available at the Central Otago Racecourse. Camping fees payable directly to the secretary of the Central Otago A&P Show and MUST be paid in advance (\$5/horse and \$5/person). Horses not to stay overnight at the show grounds.

All SATURDAY equestrian competitors must participate in the Grand Parade or forfeit prize money. All prize money must be collected on show day before 4pm. Money is not able to be paid out after Show Day. Unclaimed prize money will be forfeited at this point.

Central Otago A&P committee disclaimer:

The CO committee acknowledges that entrants entering in equine events deem themselves competent.

A hazard map will be located at the secretary caravan.

All entrants that fall off a horse must report to St. John ambulance that is on site.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1.All stock to be the bona fide property of the exhibitor
- 2. The onus of presenting exhibits to Class Stewards rests with the Exhibitor
- 3.Judging starts at 11am sharp on Friday and 8.00am sharp on Saturday and will not be delayed for late exhibits under any circumstances.
- 4.All judges are empowered to withhold the prize money in any department in which there is sufficient merit.
- 5.The Stewards in the various Classes are enjoined and empowered to prevent any person interfering with the Judges during adjudication, and no exhibitor or other person(other than the Judges, Stewards and Secretary), will be permitted to go inside the ring while exhibits are being judged, except in such cases as the Stewards may deem necessary.
- 6.All equestrian sections are run under the rules of the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand Inc. www.ras.org.nz
- 7.Leased Horses copy lease to be submitted with entry
- 8. Height Certificates must be carried
- 9.Local Boundaries for All Section; horses/ponies and riders must reside within a 30km radius of Omakau for a minimum of 60 days prior to show date. Riders may only compete at 1 show as a local.
- 10.No exhibit to be removed from the ground before 4pm except with the consent of 3 committee members (one to be the President). If the exhibitor does so, he/she forfeits any prize money.
- 11. The committee reserves to themselves the power to allot Special Prizes, of not less value for any prize money mentioned in the programme.
- 12.All protests to be lodged with the Secretary, accompanied with a deposit of \$50 within half an hour of adjudication; and if the opinion of the

- Committee, such a protest be deemed frivolous, the deposit be forfeited. The decision of the Managing Committee to be final.
- 13. Any person infringing the Rules of the Association will be liable to be disqualified.
- 14.Points for all Cups in the aggregate: First 5; Second 3; Third 1; All champions 3 points; Reserve Champion 1 point
- 15.In the event of a tie for the Cup or trophy the winner will be the exhibitor with the greatest number of firsts.
- 16. The contents of this book have been carefully compiled and are believed to be correct but the Stewards and Committee will not be liable or responsible for any inaccuracy.
- 17. All Ponies and Horses shown in the Novice Classes must be shown in Snaffle bit only.
- 18. Payments are to be made at time of entry. Otherwise entries will not be accepted. Please make sure your entry fees are correct.
- 19. This association endorses the use to the yellow card system. www.ras.org.nz
- 20. All prize money must be collected on show day before 4pm. Money is not able to be paid out after Show Day.
- 21. Trophies will be presented on Show Day but must be returned to the Secretaries office before 4pm.
- 22. Clean Sport: The use of tranquilisers, stimulants, or any other drugs capable of affecting the performance of horses and ponies is forbidden see CS in Equestrian Rulebook
- 23 ANY rider which has a fall from a horse on the grounds MUST report to the First Aid Station to be accessed.

We are not held accountable if you miss an event by showing up on the wrong date, and NO REFUNDS will be given. Friday Events will run from 11-4pm. Saturday Events will commence at 8am

RANDOM CLEAN SPORT TESTS MAY BE UNDERTAKEN

All riders competing in the pony ring MUST wear a safety approved helmet (Red Tagged)

Age of riders is at 1 August 2022. Minimum age of rider is 4 years of age.

Rider in pony jumping classes to be 17 or under on the day of Central Otago A&P Show.

Any entrant failing to report on time will automatically be eliminated. Classes will not be held for any competitor.

RECIPES

Victoria Sponge

This light cake was named in honour of Queen Victoria. Often referred to as a Victoria sandwich, it is based on equal quantities of fat, sugar, eggs and flour. It has come to be regarded as the classic English Cake and remains a favourite for baking competitions.

Serves 6-8

3 large eggs
Few drops of vanilla extract
175g/6oz/ ³/4 cup soft butter
175g/6oz/ ³/4 cup caster (superfine) sugar
175g/6oz/ ³/4 cup self-raising flour
About 60ml/4tbsp jam
Icing (confectioner's sugar, to dust

- 1) Preheat the over to 180°C/350°F/Gas 4. Better two 20cm/8in sandwich tins (layer pans) and line the bases of each with baking parchment.
- 2) Lightly beat the eggs with the vanilla extract. In a large mixing bowl, whisk the butter with the sugar until the mixture is pale, light and fluffy.
- 3) Gradually add the eggs, beating well after each addition. Sift the flour over the top and, using a metal spoon, fold in lightly until the mixture is smooth.
- 4) Divide the mixture between the prepared tins. Cook for 20 minutes until golden and firm to the touch.
- 5) Leave the cakes to cool in the tins for a few minutes then carefully turn out on to a wire rack. Remove the paper and leave to cool completely.
- 6) When the cakes are cold, sandwich the two halves together with plenty of jam. Finally, sift a little icing sugar over the top.

Cheese Cakes

175g (6ozs.) Flaky Pastry Raspberry Jam 125g (4ozs) Butter 125 g (4 ozs) Sugar 2 Eggs 150 g (5ozs) Flour 1 teaspoon Baking Powder

Cream butter and sugar. Beat eggs and add alternately with sifted flour and baking powder. Rool out pastry and line about 21 patty tins. Put 1 teaspoon of raspberry jam in the bottom of each then a large spoonful of cake mixture on top. Place a small piece of pastry on top. Bake about 20 minutes at 200°C (400°F).



Quantities are approximate as they can vary between knitters. Check the ball bands to ensure all yarn is from the same dye lot.

FOLIPMENT.

Singlet - 1 pair 3.25mm Knitting Needles and 1 set of Double Pointed 3.25mm Knitting Needles (optional) or size needed to give correct tension. A 3.00mm Crochet Hook(optional), 1 Stitch Holder, A Wool Needle for sewing up.

Hat - 1 set of double pointed 3.25mm Knitting Needles or size needed to give correct tension, A Wool Needle for sewing up.

Socks - 1 pair each 2.75mm and 3.25mm Knitting Needles or sizes needed to give correct tension, A Wool Needle for sewing up.

TENSION -

28 sts and 36 rows to 10 cm over stocking st, using 3.25mm Needles.

To work a 15 cm x 15 cm tension square, use 3.25mm Needles, cast on 42 sts. Work 54 rows stocking st. Cast off loosely.

Please check your tension carefully. If less sts use smaller needles, if more sts use bigger needles.

ABBREVIATIONS -

alt = alternate; beg = begin or beginning; ch = chain stitch (yoh and draw thread through loop already on hook); cm = centimetres; cont = continue; dc = double crochet (insert hook into work, yoh and draw through work only, yoh and draw through both loops on hook); dec = decrease, decreased, decreases or decreasing; foll = following or follows; garter st = every row knit; inc = increase, increased, increases or increasing; k = knit; mm = millimetres; 0 = no rows, stitches or times; rem = remain, remains, remainder or remaining; p = purl; rep = repeat; sl = slip; sl st = slip stitch (insert hook into work, yoh and draw through work and loop on hook); st, sts = stitch or stitches; stocking st = 1 row knit, 1 row purl; tbl = through back of loop; tog = together; yoh = yarn over hook.







SINGLET

BACK AND FRONT

(Worked in one piece) Commence at Front. Using 3.25mm needles, cast on 62 (70-78) sts.

Beg 2x2 Rib -

1st row (right side) - K2, * P2, K2, rep from * to end.

2nd row - P2, * K2, P2, rep from * to end.

Last 2 rows form 2x2 Rib.

Cont in rib until work measures 15 (17-19) cm from beg, working last row on wrong side,

SHAPE SLEEVES -

Keeping rib correct, cast on 8 sts at beg of next 2 rows ... 78 (86-94) sts.

Cont in rib until work measures 19 (22-25) cm from beg, working last row on wrong side.

SHAPE NECK -

Next row - Rib 32 (35-38) sts, cast off 14 (16-18) sts, rib to end.

Cont on last 32 (35-38) sts only for right side of front neck.

** Keeping rib correct, dec one st at neck edge on every row until 23(26-29) sts rem.

Cont without shaping until work measures 26 (29-32) cm from beg, working last row on right side.

Inc one st at neck edge on every row until there are 32 (35-38) sts, thus working last row on wrong side.

Leave these sts on a stitch-holder.

With wrong side facing, join yarn to rem sts and work as given for right side of front neck from ** to **.

Next row - Rib 32 (35-38) sts, cast on 14 (16-18) sts, rib to end ... 78 (86-94) sts.

Cont in rib until work measures 31 (35-39) cm from beg, working last row on wrong side.

SHAPE SLEEVES -

Cast off 8 sts in rib at beg of next 2 rows ... 62 (70-78) sts.

Cont in rib without shaping for a further 15 (17-19) cm.

Cast off in rib.

NECK EDGING (optional neckline choose one)

KNITTED EDGING - With right side facing and using set of 3.25mm double-pointed Needles, knit up 14 (16-18) sts evenly along centre back neck, 20 sts evenly along left back and left front neck, 14 (16-18) sts evenly along centre front neck and 20 sts evenly along right front and right back neck ... 68 (72-76) sts. Next row - Cast off purlways.

CROCHETED EDGING - With right side facing and using a 3.00mm Hook, work an even amount of dc evenly around neck edge, sl st into first dc. **2nd round** - (1dc, 3ch, 1dc) into next dc, * miss 1dc, (1dc, 3ch, 1dc) into next dc, rep from * to end. Fasten off. **TO MAKE UP** Using wool needle and mattress st seam, join side seams. Sew ends of knitted edging together. Sew in all ends.

TO MAKE UP

Using wool needle and mattress st seam, join side seams.

Tegan Baby Hat with Top Knot

The pattern has instructions for both **knitting in the round** and **knitting flat on two needles**. Choose whichever method you prefer. If you are knitting in the round, the pattern says double pointed pins (dpns) but you can use a circular needle and just switch to dpns for the crown shaping and top knot rounds if you prefer..

By tying the knot more tightly you can adjust the depth of the hat to give a better fit when needed.

Suggested yarns:

The pattern uses double knit /light worsted / 8 ply yarn
I used Paintbox Cotton DK yarn by LoveKnitting in shade Seafoam Blue (432)

Materials needed:

Approx 19(22)(25)(28)(32) grams / 48(55)(63)(70)(80) metres / 53(61)(69)(77)(88) yards of DK yarn 3.25mm (US size 3) knitting needles either straight or double pointed according to your knitting method 4mm (US size 6) knitting needles either straight or double pointed according to your knitting method Stitch marker if knitting in the round.

Tapestry needle for sewing up.

Abbreviations

dpns = double pointed needles

garter stitch = If you are knitting in the round, then work one round in knit stitch, the next in purl, and so on alternating the stitch each round. If you are knitting flat on two needles garter stitch is every row knit.
cast off = bind off in US

K = knit

K2tog = knit two stitches together

st(s) = stitch(es)

stocking st (stockinette) = every round knit when knitting in the round. First row knit second row purl if knit flat.

[] = work the instructions in the brackets by the number of times indicated

Sizes:

Preemie (premature baby) 111/2" (29 cms) relaxed around brim. Fits 4 - 6 lb baby.

0 - 3 months - 12" (30 cms) relaxed around brim. Fits head size up to 14" (35 cms)

3 - 6 months -13" (33 cms) relaxed around brim. Fits head size 14 - 16" (35 - 40 cms)

6 - 12 months - 14" (35cms) relaxed around brim. Fits head size 16 - 18" (40 - 45 cms)

1 - 2 yrs - 16" (40 cms) relaxed around brim. Fits head size 18 - 19" (45 - 48 cms)

Tension (Gauge)

22 sts and 30 rows to 4" (10 cms) square in stocking stitch on 4mm (US Size 6) needles Please take time to knit a tension square. If your square is too small, try again using larger needles. If your square is too big, try again on smaller sized needles.

Instructions are given for the first size. Figures in brackets () refer to the larger sizes. Where only one figure is given it applies to all sizes. You may wish to circle with a pencil the instructions for the size you are making.

Knit in the Round Instructions

Using your smaller double pointed pins cast on 66(72)(78)(84)(90) sts, place stitch marker and join to begin knitting in the round.

Work 8 rounds garter stitch.

Change to your larger needles and work in stocking st. until the hat measures $3\frac{1}{3}(3\frac{1}{2})(4)$ $(4\frac{1}{4})(4\frac{3}{4})$ inches 8(9)(10)(11)(12) cms from the cast on edge.

Crown Shaping & Top Knot

Round 1: [K2tog, K4] to end

55(60)(65)(70)(75) sts

Rounds 2 - 4: Work 3 rounds stocking st

Round 5: [K2tog, K3] to end

44(48)(52)(56)(60) sts

Rounds 6 - 8: Work 3 rounds stocking st

Round 9: [K2tog, K2] to end

33(36)(39)(42)(45) sts

Round 10: Knit

Round 11: [K2tog, K1] to end

22(24)(26)(28)(30) sts

Round 12: Knit

Round 13: [K2tog] to end

11(12)(13)(14)(15) sts

Rounds 14 - 18: Work 5 rounds stocking st.

Round 19: [K2tog, K1] 3(4)(4)(4)(5) times,

K2(0)(1)(2)(0) sts 8(8)(9)(10)(10) sts

You may find it easier to work on just 2 pins plus the picking one from this point onwards.



Rounds 20 - 32: Work 13 rounds stocking st. Round 33:

(1st & 2nd sizes) K2tog, K2, K2tog, K2 6 sts

(3rd size) K2tog, K2, [K2tog] 2 times, K1 6 sts

(4th & 5th sizes) K1, [K2tog] 2 times, K1, [K2tog] 2 times 6 sts

Work 10(12)(14)(16)(18) rounds stocking st. Cast off.

To Make Up

Sew in loose ends. Tie the top piece into a knot.



Knit Flat Instructions

Using your smaller needles cast on 67(73)(79) (85)(91) sts.

Work 8 rows garter stitch.

Change to your larger needles and work in stocking st. until the hat measures $3\frac{1}{4}(3\frac{1}{2})(4)$ $(4\frac{1}{4})(4\frac{3}{4})$ inches 8(9)(10)(11)(12) cms from the cast on edge.

Crown Shaping & Top Knot

Row 1: K1, [K2tog, K4] to end

56(61)(66)(71)(76) sts

Rows 2 - 4: Work 3 rows stocking st

Row 5: K1, [K2tog, K3] to end

45(49)(53)(57)(61) sts

Rows 6 - 8: Work 3 rows stocking st

Row 9: K1, [K2tog, K2] to end

34(37)(40)(43)(46) sts

Row 10: Purl

Row 11: K1, [K2tog, K1] to end

23(25)(27)(29)(31) sts

Row 12: Purl

Row 13: K1,[K2tog] to end

Rows 14 - 18: Work 5 rows stocking st.

Row 19: K1,[K2tog, K1] 3(4)(4)(4)(5) times, K2(0)(1)(2)(0) sts 9(9)(10)(11)(11) sts

(1st & 2nd sizes) K1,K2tog, K2, K2tog, K2

7 sts

(3rd size) K1, K2tog, K2, [K2tog] 2 times, K1

7 sts

7 sts

(4th & 5th sizes) K1, [K2tog] 2 times, K2,

[K2tog] 2 times

Work 9(11)(13)(15)(17) rows stocking st. Cast off.

To Make Up

Sew up the back seam and sew in any loose ends.

Note: The top knot section needs to be sewn together from the front, so it is easiest to use mattress stitch and work from the front for the entire seam.

- 'Best Table' means a freshly dug or picked vegetable, that is of moderate size, washed and looks well.
- **Beans and Peas** uniform size, 1 cm of stalk on top
- **Beetroot, Carrots and Parsnips** -leave all roots intact and about 6cm of stalk on top
- *Cabbage* trim outer leaves
- *Courgettes/Zucchini* best at normal size, not gross
- *Lettuce* -Remove outside leaves

- *Onions* Trim roots slightly, tidy up outer skin, 8-10cm stalk to be doubled over and secured with band or string
- Parsley Bright green, clean and fresh
- *Potato* a table potato should fit into a cupped hand
- *Rhubarb* -leave a fraction of green on top of stalk, tear stalk off crown, don't cut
- Garlic trim roots but don't cut completely off, leave short stalk on bulbs
- *Tomatoes* -green growing stalks must be attached
